


BAS Family and Individual Mini-Grant Program 2007 – 2014

For the 8th consecutive year, the Bureau of Autism Services (BAS) was pleased to offer the Family and Individual Mini-Grant. The focus of this project was to reach out and provide needed resources to individuals and families that are not able to access existing support systems for various reasons (for example, eligibility criteria, age, waiting lists).


To date, the Family and Individual Mini-Grant program awarded **\$6,747,840.53** in grants (up to \$500 each). The following chart displays the total amount of dollars expended by year.



A total of **14,980 families and individuals with autism** received funding. The following table shows the amount funded, the number of grants awarded, and the number of children and adults that received a grant, by year.


The following chart displays the number of individuals that have received a mini-grant in each year.




Of the number of individuals who have received a mini-grant, this table displays the total number of adults and children that received a mini-grant.

The chart below shows the breakdown of how many adults and how many children received a mini-grant by year.




The mini-grant program has provided funding for many different activities and supports throughout the eight years the program was available. The chart below shows the activities that were approved and the number of people who received them.
